Study of the U.S. Institute for Student Leaders on Environmental Issues



Study of the U.S. Institutes (SUSIs) for Student Leaders are five- to six-week academic programs for foreign undergraduate students between the ages of 18 and 25 designed to improve their understanding of the United States and to develop their leadership skills. Institutes include a four-week academic residency consisting of interactive classroom activities, discussions, lectures, readings, site visits, and workshops; one week of educational travel to a different region of the United States; leadership skills building activities; community service; and opportunities to interact with their American peers on a college campus. Each institute includes approximately 20 participants from selected countries.

PROGRAM DESCRIPTION: The Study of the U.S. Institute for Student Leaders from Europe on Youth, Education, and Closing the Skills Gap will explore how advances in technologies such as artificial intelligence, automation, and robotics are shaping how we work, where we work, and the skills and education required to work. The Institute will expose participants to global issues in the context of the future of work by examining educational, social and economic trends. Using an interdisciplinary approach, the academic program will examine the role of U.S. educational institutions, particularly community colleges, in preparing Americans with the skills needed to succeed in multiple industries and sectors including business, technology, science, higher education, the creative arts and other fields.

LOCATION: The Institute for Student Leaders from Europe on Youth, Education, and Closing the Skills Gap will be hosted by a U.S. university (TBC). The academic residency will be complemented by an educational tour that will take participants to another area of the U.S. where they will meet with local, state, private, and not-for-profit organizations working in the field. The Institute will then conclude with a visit to Washington, D.C.

BENEFITS: Participants in the Institute will receive the following benefits:

- Full funding of all program costs
- Full funding of international travel to/from program
- Housing in on-campus dorms with meals at campus facilities for program duration
- Sickness and accident insurance through U.S. Department of State

ELIGIBILITY: The Study of the U.S. Institute for Student Leaders is a program for current students between 18 and 25 years of age with little to no prior study or travel experience in the United States. Successful candidates will have at least one semester left of their undergraduate studies, and therefore be committed to return to their home universities following completion of the program. They should demonstrate proficiency in English, an interest in the institute topic and in learning about the United States, and high levels of leadership, community engagement, and academic achievement. They should be mature, responsible, independent, confident, open-minded, tolerant, thoughtful, and inquisitive, and should be willing and able to fully participate in an intensive academic program, community service, and educational travel.

HOW TO APPLY: Applications for the Institute on Environmental Issues will be posted online in late November 2018 on www.fulbright.be. The application must be completed (typed), scanned, and returned by email to adviser@fulbright.be by January 11, 2019. The complete application includes biographical information, a 250-word essay, and two reference forms to be completed by professors or professional supervisors and returned as a total package. A mandatory in-person interview will take place in late January 2019 in Brussels and candidates will be notified the following week.
